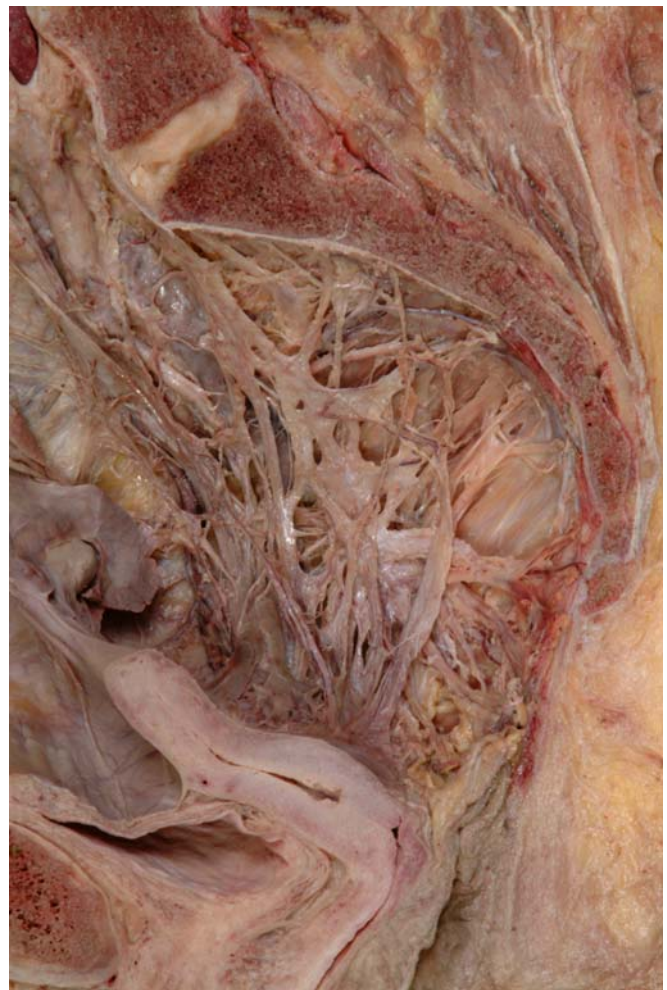

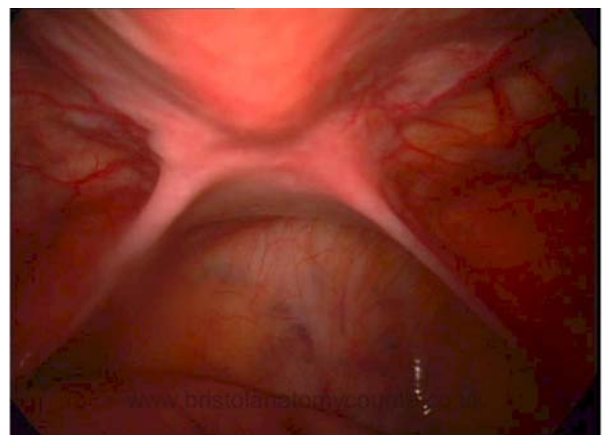
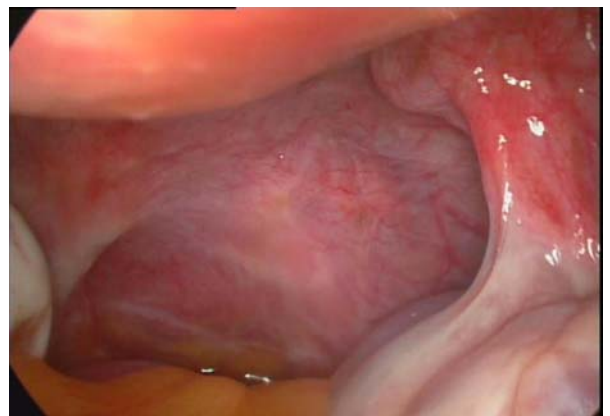
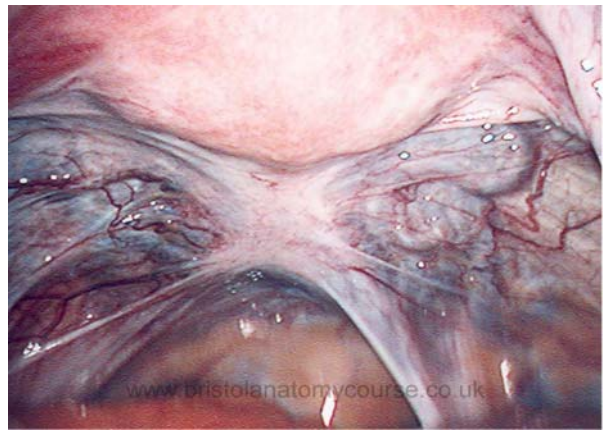
If you have any interesting cases or series then bring them to the participants session.
